By these presents that I Thomas Dabth of the Parish of St. Pancras in the County of Middlesex doe by these presents make ordaine constitute and appoint and in my stead and place put Margaret Dike of the Parish aforesaid wife of James Dike Merchant my true and lawfull Attorney for me and in my name and to her use to aske demand sue for recover and recieve of all persons whom these shall or may concern all such summe and summes of Money Debts Dues and demands that is or shall be due to me the said Thomas Dabth either in his Majestyes service or on Merchants affairs and to have use and take all lawfull wayes and means in my name or otherwise for recovery thereof and acquittances or other sufficient discharges for the same for me and in my name and to my use to make seal and deliver and to doe all other acts and things whatsoever concerning the premises as fully in every respect as if my self might or could doe if I were personally present and Attorney out or more under her for the purposes aforesaid to make and againe at her pleasure to revoke and I the said Thomas Dabth doe here by ratify and confirme whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully doe or cause to be done in my name or otherwise by force of these presents And I the said Thomas Dabth doe hereby make and ordaine this to be my last Will and Testament in writing and the said Margaret Dike my full and sole Executrix hereby revoking and making void all former Wills by me made Witness my hand and seal this ninth day of March Anno Dni One thousand six hundred seventy nine. / Thomas Dabth / Sealed and delivered in the presence of James Morant her manke Elizabeth Sharp.
